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# Independent Auditor's Report 

## To the Members of Malar Stars Medicare Limited

## Report on the Audit of the Financial Statements


#### Abstract

Opinion We have audited the financial statements of Malar Stars Medicare Limited (the "Company") which comprise the balance sheet as at 31 March 2023, and the statement of profit and loss (including other comprehensive income), statement of changes in equity and statement of cash flows for the year then ended, and notes to the financial statements, including a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information.

In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, the aforesaid financial statements give the information required by the Companies Act, 2013 ("Act") in the manner so required and give a true and fair view in conformity with the accounting principles generally accepted in India, of the state of affairs of the Company as at 31 March 2023, and its profit and other comprehensive income, changes in equity and its cash flows for the year ended on that date.


## Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audit in accordance with the Standards on Auditing (SAs) specified under Section $143(10)$ of the Act. Our responsibilities under those SAs are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. ## 1. Nature of operations:

Malar Stars Medicare Limited (Malar Stars' or 'the Company') was incorporated on 7 July 2009 in Chennai. The Company is a $100 \%$ subsidiary of Fortis Malar Hospitals Limited and is primarily engaged in the business of providing medical and surgical consultancy serviees to its Holding Company. Fortis Healthcare Limited is the Ulimate Folding Company.

## 2. Basis of preparation

a) Statement of complinnce

These financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Indian Accounting Standards (lad AS) as per the Companies (Indian Accounting Standards) Rules, 2015 notified under Section 133 of Companies Act, 2013, (the 'Acl') read together with Rule 3 of' the Companies (Jndian Accounting Standards) Rules, 2015 and the relcvant amendment rules issued thereafter, pronouncements of regulatory bodies applicable to the Company and other provisions of the Act. The accounting policies adopled in the preparation of the financial statements are consistent with those followed in the previous year.

The financial statements were aulhorised for issue by the Company's Board of Directors on 15 May 2023.
b) Functional and presentation currency

These finsucial statements are presented in Indian Rupees ('INR'/ "Rs'), which is also the Company's functional currency. All amounts have been rounded-off to the nearest lakhs, unless otherwise indicaled.
c) Basis of measurement

The financial statements have been prepared on the historical cost basis except for the following items:

d) Use of estimates and judgements

In preparing these financial statements, management/directors has made the following judgentents, estimates and assumptions that affect the application of accounting policies and the reported amounts of assets, liabilities, income and expenses. Actual results may differ from these estimates.

Estimates and underlying assumptions are reviewed on an ongoing basis. Revisions to accounting estimates are recognised prospectively,

## Judgements

## c) Measurement of fair values

A number of the Company's accounting policies and disclosures requite measurement of fair values, for boulh financial and non-financial assets and liabilities.

The Company has an established control framework with respeet to the measurement of fair values.
The Company regularly reviews significant unobservable inputs and valuation adjustments. If third party information, is used to measure fair valucs, then the Company assesses the cvidence oblained from the third partics to support the conclusion that these valuations meet the requirements of Ind AS, including the level in the fair value hierarchy in which the valuations should be classified. Significant valuation issues are reported to the Company's audit conmiltee.

Fair values are categorised into different levels in a fair value hierarchy based on the inputs used in the valuation techniques as follows:

- Level 1: quoted prices (unadjusted) in active markets for identical assets or liabilities.
- I, evel 2: inputs other than quoted prices inchuded in Level I that are observable for the asset or liability, either
directly (i.e, as prices) or indirectly (i.e., derived from prices).
- Level 3: inputs for the asset or liability that are not based on observable market data (unobservable inputs).

When measuring the fair values of an asset or a liability, the Company uses observable market data as far as possible. If the inputs used to measure the fair value of an assel or a liability fall into different levels of the fair value hierarchy, then the fair value measurement is categorised in its entirety in the same level of the fair value hierarchy as the lowest level imput that is significant to the entire measurement
The Company recognises transfer between levels of the lair value hicrarcly at the end of the reporting period during which the change has occurred.
Further information about the assumptions made in measuring fair values is included in Note 22 - financial instruments.

## 3. Signifiennt mecounting polices

### 3.1 Pinancial instruntuts

## i) Recogntion and initial neasurement

Trade receivables are initially recognised when they are originated. All other financial assets and financial liabilities are initially recogaised when the Company becomes a party to the contractual provisions of the iustument
A financial asset or financial liability is initually measured at fair value plus, for an item not at fair value through profit and loss (FVTPL), transaction costs that are directly attributable to its acquisition or issue.
ii) C.Inssilication and subsequent measurement

## Financial assets

On initial recognition, a financinl asset is classified as measured at

- amorlised cost;
- Fair value through other comprehensive income ( FVOCI ) - equity investment; or
- FVTPL

Financial assets are not reclassified subseguent to their initial recognition, except if and in the period the Company changes its business model for managing financial assets.

A financial asset is measured at amortised cost if it meets both of the following conditions and is not designated as al FV'TPL:

- the asset is held within a business model whose objective is to hold assets to collect contractual cash flows; and
- the contractual terms of the financial asset give rise on specified dates to cash flows that are solely payments of principal and interest on the principal amount outstanding.

For the purposes of this assessment, 'principal' is defined as the fair value of the financial asset on initial recognition. 'Interest' is defined as consideration for the time value of money and for credit risk associated with the principal amount oulstanding during a particular period of time and for other basic lending risks and costs (e.g. liquidity risk and administrative costs), as well as a profit margin.

On initial recognition of an equily investment that is not held for trading, the Company may irrevocably elect to present subsequent changes in the investment's frir value in OCI (designated as FVOCI - equity investuent). This election is made on an invesunent- by-investment basis.

All financial assets not classitied as measured at amortised cost as described above are measured at FVTPL. This includes all derivative financial assets. On initial recognition, the Company may irrevocably designate a financial asset that otherwise meets the requirements to be measured at amortised cost as at FVTPL if doing so eliminates or significantly reduces an accounting mismatch that would otherwise arise.

## Financiurl assets

The Company derecognises a financial asse when the contractual rights to the castr flows from the financial asset expire, or it transfers the rights to receive the contractual cash flows in a transaction in which substantially all of the risks and rewards of ownership of the financial ussel are transferred or in which the Conpany neither transfers nor retains substantially all of the risks and rewards ofownership and does not retain control of the financial assel.

If the Company enters into transactions whereby it transfers assets recognised on its balance sheet, but retains either all or substantially all of the risks and rewards of the transferred assets, the transferred assels are not derccognised.

## Financial liablities

The Company derecoguises a Iinancial liability when its conlractual obligations are discharged or cancelled, or expire.
The Company also derecognises a financial liability when its terns are modified and the cash flows under the modilied terms are substantially different. In this case, a new financial liability based on the modified terns is recognised at fair value. The difference between the carrying amount of the financial liability extinguished and the new financial liability with modified terms is recognised in profil or loss.

## iv) Ofisetting

Financial assets and financial liabilities are offset and the net amount presented in the balance sheet when, and only when, the Company currently has a legally enforceable right to set off the amounts and it intends either to sette them on a net basis or to realise the asset and sellie the liability simultaneously.

## v) Casll and eash equivalents (for the purpose of Cash Flow Statement)

Cash and cash equivalent in the balance sheet comprise cash al banks and on hand and short-term deposits with an original naturity of three months or less, which are subject to an insignificant risk of changes in value. For the purpose of the statement of cash tlows, cash and cash equivalents consist of cash and short-term deposits, as delined above, net of outstanding bank overdralls as they are considered an integral patt of the Company's cash manngement.

### 3.2 Employee benefils

i) Short-ferm employee benefits

Shorl-term employee benefit obligations are measured on an undiscounted basis and are expensed as the related service is provided. A liability is recoguised for the amount expected to be paid c.g., under short-term cash bonus, if the Company has a present legal or construclive ubligation to pay this amount as a result of past service provided by the employee, and the amount of obligation can be estimated reliably.

The Company presents the leave as a current liability in the balance sheet; to the extent it does not have an uncondilional right to defer its settement for 12 months after the reporting date. Where Company has the unconditional legal and contractual right to defer the settlement for a period beyond 12 montilis, the same is presented as non-current liability.

## ii) Defined benefit plans - Gratuity

A defined benefit plan is a post-employment benefit plan other than a defined contribution plan. The Company's net obligation in respect of detimed benefit plans is calculated separately for each plan by estimating the amount of future benefit that employees have earned in the cutrent and prior periods, discounting that amount and deducting the fair value of any plan assets.

The calculation of detined benefit obligation is performed annually by a qualified actuary using the projected unit credit method. When the calculation results in a potential asset for the Connpany, the recognised asset is limited to the present value of economic benefits available in the form of any fulure refunds from the plan or reductions in future contributions to the plan ('the asset ceiling'). In order to calculate the present value of economic benefits, consideration is given to any minimum funding requirements.

Remeasurements of the net defined benefil liability, which comprise actuarial gains and losses, the retum on plan assels (excluding interest) and the effect of the assel ceiling (if any, excluding interest), are recogrised in OCl . The Company determines the net interest expense (income) on the net detined benefil liability (asset) for the period by applying the discount rale used to measure the defined benefit obligation at the begiming of the annual period to the then-net defined benefit liability (asset), taking into account any changes in the net defined benefit liability (asset) during the period as a result of contributions and benefit payments, Net interest expense and oulber expenses related to defined bencfit plans are recognised in Statement of prolit or loss,

When the benefits of a plan are changed or when a plan is curtailed, the resulting change in benefit that relates to past service ('past service cost' or 'past service gain') or the gain or loss on curtailment is recognised immediately in profit or loss. The Company recognises gains and losses on the settlement of a detined benefit plan when the settlement occurs.

## iii) Share-based compensmiton

The Company is covered under lhe Employee Stock Ophion Plan of Fortis Malar Hospitals Limiled, the Holding Company Under the plan, some of the eligible employees of the Company may be granted employee stock option of Fortis Malar Hospitals Limited in accordance with the lerms and conditions as specified in the plan. The plan is assessed, matraged and administered by the Folding Company, whose options have heen granted to employees of the Company and the Holding Company has not transferred any charge on account of stuck expense to the Company.

### 3.3 Prowlions (other than for emplogee benefits)

A provision is recognised if, as a result of a past event, the Company has a present legal or constructive obligation that wan be cstimated reliably, and it is probable that an outflow of economic benefits will be required to settle the obligation. Provisions are determined by discounting the expected future cash flows (representing the best estimate of the expenditure required to seltle the present obligation at the balance sheet (late) at a pre-tax rate that reflects current markel assessments of the time value of money and the tisks specilic to the liability. The unwinding of the discount is recognised as finance cost. Expected future operating losses are not provided for:

### 3.4 Revenue recognition

The Company carns revenue primarily fiom providing inedical and surgical consultancy services. The Company has applied lad AS 115 which establishes a comprehensive framework for determining whether, how much and whell revenue is to be recognised.

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable. Revenue is reduced for returns, trade allowances for deduction, rebates, value added taxes and amounts collected on belialf of third parties.
Revenue is recognized to the extent that it is probable that the economic benefits will flow to the Company and the revenue can be reliably measured.
The Company assessed its revenue arrangements against specific criteria to determine it is acting as principal or agent. The Company las concluded that it is acting as a principal in all its revenue arrangements.
Operating Income
Income from medical and surgical consultancy services provided to its Holding Company based on an agreed cost plus formula.

### 3.5 Recoguition of interest income or expense

Interest income or expense is recognised using the effective interest method.
The "effective interest rate" is the rate that exactly discounts estimated future cash payments or receipls through the expected tife of the financial instrument to:

- the gross carrying amount of the financial asset; or
- the amortized cost of the financial liability.

In catculating intercst income and expense, the effective interest tate is applicd to the gross carrying amount or the asset (when the asset is not credit-impaired) or to the amortized cost of the liability. Hovever, for financial assets that have become credit-impaired subsequent to initial recognition, interest income is calculated by applying the effective interest rate to the amotized cost of the financial asset, If the assel is no longer credit-impaired, then the calculation of interest income reverts to the gross basis.

## 3.6 fncome tax

Income lax comprises current and deferred lax. It is recognised in profit or loss except to the extent that it relates to a business combination or 10 an item recognised directly in equity or in other comprehensive income.

## i) Current fas:

Current tax comprises the expected tax payable or receivable on the taxable income or loss for the year and any adjustment to the tax payable or reccivable in respect of previous years. The amount of current tax reflects the best estimate of the tax amount expected to be paid or reccived after considering the uncertanty, if any, related to income laxes. It is measured using tax rates (and lax laws) enacted or substantively enacted by the reporting date.

Curent tax assets and current tax liabilities are offset only if there is a legally enforceable right to set off the recognised amounts, and it is iutended to realise the asset and settle the liability on a net basis or simultaneously.

## ii) Deferred fax

Deferred tax is recognised in respect of temporary difleerences between the carrying amounts of assels and liabilities for financiat reporting purposes and the corresponding abounts used for taxation purposes. Delerred tax is also recognised in respect of carricd forward tax losses and lax credits. Deferred tax is not recognised for:

- temporary differences arising on the initial recogation of assets or liabilities in a transaction that is not a business combination and that affects ncither accounting nor taxable protit or loss at the time of the transaction;
- temporary differences related to investments in subsidiaries to the extent that the Company is able to control the timing of the reversal of the temporary differences and it is probable that they will not reverse in the forcseeable future:

Deferted tax assets are recognised to the extent that it is probable that future taxable prolits will be avaifable agtinst which they can be used. The existence of umused tax losses is strong evidence that future taxable profit may not be available. Therefore, in case of a history of recent losses, the Company recognises a deferred tax asset only to the extent that it has sufficient taxable temporary differences or there is convincing other evidence that suflicient taxable profit will be avaibable against which such deferred tax asset can be realised. Deferred tax assets - turecognised or recognised, arc revicwed at each reporting date and are recognised/reduced to the extent that it is probable/ no longer probable respectively that the related tax benefit will be realised.

Deferred tax is measured at the tax rates that are expected to apply to the period when the asset is realised or the liability is setted, based on the lavs that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the reponing date.
The measurement of deferred tax reflects the tax consequences that would follow from the manner in which the Company expects, at the reporting date, to recover or seltle the carrying amount of its assets and liabilities.
Deferred tax assets and liabilities are offset if there is a legally enforceable right to offset cureent tax liabilities and assets, and they relate to income taxes levied by the same tax authority on the same taxable entity, or on different tax entities, but they intend to settle current tax liabilities and assets on anet basis or their tax assets and liabilities will be realised simultancously.

### 3.7 Borrowing costs

Borrowing costs are interest and other costs (including exchange differences relating to foreign currency borrowings to the extent that they are regarded as an adjustment to interest costs) incurred in connection with the borrowing of funds. Borrowing costs directly attributable to acpuisition or construction of an assel which necessarily take a substantial period of time to get ready for their intended use are capitalised as part of the cost of that asset. Other borrowing costs are recognised as an expense in the period in which they are incurred.

### 3.8 Earmings per share

The Company presents basic and diluted earnings per share ("EPS") data for its equity shares.
Basic earnings per share is compuied using the weighted average number of equity shares outstanding during the period adjusted for treasury shares held. Diluted earnings per share is computed using the weighted average number of equity and dilutive equivalent shares outstanding during the period except where the results would be anti-dilutive.
Potential equity shares are deemed to be dilutive only if their conversion to equity shares would decrease carning per share from continuing operations. Potential dilutive equity shares are deemed to be converted as at the begiming of the period, unless they have been issued at a later date. The dilutive potential equity shares are adjusted for the proceeds reccivable had the shares been actually issued at fair value (i.e. avcrage markel valuc of the outstnading shares). Difutive potential equity shares are detemmed independently for eash year / period presented.

### 3.9 Contimgent liabilities

A contingent liability is a possible obligation that arises from past events whose cxistence will be confirmed by the occurrence or monoccurrence of one or more uncertain tuture events beyond the control of the Company or a present obligation that is not recognized becnuse it is not probable that an outdow of resources will be required to settle the obligation. A contingent liability also arises in extremely rare cases where there is a liability that cannot be recognized because it cannot be measured reliably. The Company docs not recognize a contingent liability but discloses its cxistence in the linuncial statements.
